<u>Food</u>

Bovril, Biscuits, Spread, Dried milk, Dried egg, Flour, Yeast, Sunflower oil, Lard, Dried veg, Dried pulses, Dried soup mix, Oats, Barley grains, Tinned fish/ Tuna, Tinned meat / corned beef etc, Tinned veg, Bread, Tomato paste, Salt /herbs/pepper, Stock cubes, Tomato ketchup, Mayonaise, Sugar, Condensed

Salt /herbs/pepper, Stock cubes, Tomato ketchup, Mayonaise, Sugar, Condensed milk, Sweeteners, Tea, Coffee, UHT milk, Dried Pasta eg vermicelli, Rice, Instant mash potato, Noodles, High energy bars, Energy gels

Medication

Paracetamol, Ibuprofen anti inflammatory drugs, Calpol, Lemsip, Anti histamine Gaviscon.
