African Adventure - Ghana

For several years our school has enjoyed a link with New Life Ghana, a charitable project committed to the physical and spiritual welfare of children in Ghana. During half term, Mrs Ward and Mrs Mallett visited Diamond Hill School,

which is near Accra in Ghana, to support the work of the project.

Diamond Hill School is thriving. The children and staff are a joy to be with. We laughed, danced, sang and played with the children. We were welcomed with a dancing and drumming performance and on Friday we were invited to join in with their sports day races, which included a lime and spoon race! At Diamond Hill we repainted three classrooms and went shopping in the bustling street markets for school supplies, library books and nursery toys. We also delivered two seminars: early phonics and behaviour management.











The project also took us out to the remote, rural village of Honi. We were astounded by the resilience of the villagers, who have been severely affected by the global economy and are struggling to meet basic needs.



We worked in the Honi government school to create a nursery classroom and to transform the Reception classroom. We painted and decorated the classrooms, supplied tables and chairs and educational resources.



The head teacher cried with joy as he thanked us and the children could hardly contain their excitement! At one point it felt like the whole school squeezed into the classroom to see it. In fact, on the second day, word had got out about the new classrooms and the school had full attendance for the first time ever! The school will now also be able to offer nursery education.

I am delighted to tell you that the work in Honi was funded by money raised by Carlton Miniott Primary Academy. Thank you so much to everyone who has supported this project.
